

PROGRAMMES ON OFFER AND REQUIREMENTS

1. BACHELOR OF EDUCATION HONOURS IN JUNIOR PRIMARY LEVEL 8

- Grade 12 (AS) holders are required to have a minimum of 25 points in five subjects with a minimum of a D in English.
- Mature Age: 25 years or older, 20 points in Grade 12, with at least 3 years of relevant experience and a D in English.

2. BACHELOR OF EDUCATION HONOURS IN SENIOR PRIMARY LEVEL 8

- Grade 12 (AS) holders are required to have a minimum of 25 points in five subjects with a minimum of a D in English.
- Mature Age: 25 years or older, 20 points in Grade 12, with at least 3 years of relevant experience and a D in English.

3. POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN EDUCATION (SECONDARY) (LEVEL 8)

 Requires a Bachelor's degree at NQF Level 7 or equivalent, with two teaching subjects.

4. DIPLOMA IN EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT AND JUNIOR PRIMARY EDUCATION (LEVEL 6)

- Grade 11/12 (AS) Level: 22 points in 5 subjects (D in local language; D in English)
- Mature Age: 20 points in Grade 10 in 6 subjects, 23 years or older plus relevant teaching experience.

NEW PROGRAMMES

5. BACHELOR OF SECONDARY EDUCATION HONOURS IN LANGUAGES. LEVEL 8 Requirements:

 Grade 12 (AS) holders are required to have a minimum of 25 points in 5 subjects (including English) minimum symbol C in local languages (for example Oshikwanyama, Oshindonga, Afrikaans, Silozi, Rukwangali, etc.)

6. POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY (LEVEL 8)

 Applicants must hold an education, in social work, or psychology qualification at NQF level 7.

7. CERTIFICATE IN INTERACTIVE MEDIA DESIGN AND WEB DEVELOPMENT (LEVEL 4)

- At least 18 points or more in Grade 11/12, an NQF level 3 in IT, or eligibility through Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL).
- Mature Age entry, 23 years or older with a Grade 10 certificate and relevant experience.

8. DIPLOMA IN INTERACTIVE MEDIA AND WEB DEVELOPMENT (LEVEL 5)

- 22 points in Grade 12/AS or an NQF level 4 qualification in ICT.
- Eligible through RPL for applicants with relevant experience and qualifications.

NATIONAL CERTIFICATE IN HORTICULTURE AND CROP HUSBANDRY (LEVEL 2)

- Requirement: Grade 10 certificate.

10. CERTIFICATE IN EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT (LEVEL 4)

- Grade 11/12 with a minimum of 10 points
 Grade 10 certificate holders will be considered.
- Note: Applicants with relevant experience and qualifications may be eligible through Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL).
