Greetings to all of you, and a hearty welcome to this year's graduation ceremony. This is the College's 8th graduation ceremony.

When Sunshine Private College (PTY) started in 2020, it was a small college comprising only 15 students enrolled for the Post Graduate Diploma in Education (PGDE), Bachelor of Education Honours degree in Junior Primary and Bachelor of Education Honours degree in Senior Primary. Many developments have taken place since the first graduation ceremony in 2021.

The College has expanded its scope to include the much-needed three-year Diploma in Early Childhood Development and Junior Primary Education on its offerings. Furthermore, there are thirteen qualifications which are in the long process of accreditation. These qualifications are mostly postgraduate qualifications. It is my pleasure to announce that the numbers of graduates have been increasing every year. Today we witness over ninety students graduating in four programmes.

In addition to these positive developments, Sunshine Private College (PTY) and Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU). Under this MOU, Sunshine Private College (PTY) is running some certificate, diploma, bachelor and post graduate programmes from Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University. This academic collaboration between the two higher education institutions is of mutual benefit.

The collaboration between our College and ZEGU is a milestone for the College, our students and stakeholders; it is a step in the right direction. The MOU is a significant achievement in Sunshine Private College's internationalisation of higher education journey. The Sunshine Private College (PTY) and Zimbabwe Ezekiel Guti University academic partnership has already started bearing fruits. Some students have been registered for Master's and PhD degrees at ZECGU through Sunshine Private College (PTY).

I pay tribute to Her Excellency Dr Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwa, the President of the Republic of Namibia, for launching the subsidised education system in Namibia this year which gives relief to parents and guardians, because registration and tuition fees at tertiary institutions are paid by the government for students who meet the criteria. It is noteworthy that students studying at both public and private institutions are covered by the subsidised education system, a move that has been highly commended by all stakeholders. This a brilliant initiative; it has already begun to have positive results. And we thank our President for that.

Hon Dr Emma Kantema

Minister of Gender Equality and Child Welfare

Hon Dr Emma Kantema, born on 16 August 1978, in Rupara, Kavango Region, is a distinguished Namibian politician and public servant. As of 22 March 2025, she has been appointed by President Netumbo Nandi-Ndaitwah as the Minister of Gender Equality and Child Welfare. Her appointment marks a significant milestone in her career, following her impactful tenure as Deputy Minister at the Ministry of Sport, Youth, and National Service.

Dr Kantema is a highly accomplished academic with a Doctorate in Business Administration from the University of Namibia. Her doctoral research focused on the determinants of success for youth-owned small and medium enterprises in the Kavango Region, reflecting her commitment to youth empowerment and economic development.

Dr Kantema has had an illustrious career spanning both the public and corporate sectors. She previously served as Executive Director at the Ministry of Sport, Youth, and National Service and held key roles at the Social Security Commission, including Company Secretary and Acting CEO (2015–2016). Her expertise in corporate governance has been instrumental in shaping policies and strategies across various institutions. She is also a founding Board Director for the Namibia Civil Aviation Authority, a Trustee for the Sam Nujoma Marine and Coastal Resources Research Centre (SANUMARC), and has served on governing councils such as NUST, NIPAM Governing Council, and the Namibia Institute of Corporate Governance.

Dr Kantema joined national politics in 2020 when she was appointed Deputy Minister of Sport, Youth, and National Service by former President Hage Geingob. She concurrently became a Member of Parliament under SWAPO's leadership. Her dedication to public service has been recognized through her reappointment to increasingly significant roles within Government.

A visionary leader, Dr Kantema is deeply committed to fostering gender equality, child welfare, youth empowerment, and excellence in corporate governance. Her leadership at the Ministry of Gender Equality and Child Welfare reflects her passion for creating inclusive policies that uplift vulnerable populations while driving sustainable development.
